



#### **FEEDERWATCH**

## November-April | 2-hour shifts weekdays or weekends

Citizen scientists needed! Help us count the birds visiting our bird feeders this winter as part of the Cornell Lab of Ornithology's Project FeederWatch.

Volunteers of all birding abilities are welcome. Training is provided.

FeederWatch is a joint research and education project of The Cornell Lab of Ornithology Lab and Birds Canada. It is a November through April survey of birds in which thousands of FeederWatchers in communities across North America count birds and send their tallies to the FeederWatch database. FeederWatch scientists then analyze the data to detect and explain gradual changes in the wintering ranges of many species. This project is so important because there is no other means of collecting this valuable data about bird population biology.
