ONLINE SALE

- The online sale will no longer include annuals and will focus strictly on natives and native perennial gardens.
- · We are working through details to continue to offer delivery options and also include potential order pick-up options.
- · Quantities and orders in the online sale will be limited. First-come, first-served.
- · More details on delivery options, sale timing, and offerings will be forthcoming in late winter.

• The day-of plant sale on May 11 will be expanded to include a larger selection of annuals, baskets, and mixed pots, trees, shrubs, and larger container sized perennials with no minimum order quantity, and curbside loading.
